






The First Ladies by Marie Benedict & Victoria Christopher Murray




Remarkably Bright Creatures by Shelby Van Pelt




Lessons in Chemistry by Bonnie Garmus




#### No Two Persons by Erica Bauermeister




## The Dry by Jane Harper




#### The Spectacular by Fiona Davis
