Dear Redeemer Family,

You've surely heard the old saying, "There are no atheists in foxholes." I recently heard another good truism from a friend. He said, "Quit grousing about the absence of prayer in public schools, Father, because as long as there are final exams, there will always be prayer in schools!" Fair enough. Considering our recent unwanted visitors — Debby, Helene, and Milton — I'll bet more prayers have come out of Sarasota County in the last three months than in the last three years combined. (Fun fact: did you know *The Book of Common Prayer* has a catch-all prayer that is recommended for emergencies? It is rooted in the Psalms, and it goes like this: "O God make speed to save us. O Lord make haste to help us!" I've never used it in an actual emergency, because the Alabama version I learned as a kid is shorter and just as effective. It goes like this: "Help me, Jesus!" You're welcome.)

More seriously, though, what and when you pray is the quickest and clearest window into what you really think about God. There's a melodic Latin jingle that attests to this: "lex orandi, lex credendi," which basically means what you pray reveals what you believe about God more than anything else. In other words, tell me what you pray, and I'll show you exactly what you really think about God, yourself, and how you relate to the world around you.

How is your prayer life, by the way? Have you called on God to help you lately — to give you a measure of comfort, wisdom, or peace? The Western world is so awash with self-help podcasts, life hacks, and Google searches that prayer is often the last place we turn when facing the inevitable difficulties that come with life. When the going gets tough, don't try looking for motivation and strength within. Reach out, not in. Call on the name of Jesus in all your distress — "cast all your anxiety on Him, because He cares for you" (I Peter 5:7).

The All Saints' Day service on **Friday, November 1, at 6 p.m.** is an annual favorite. Fr. Charleston Wilson will be the preacher.

The mass setting is Harold Darke's Communion Service in E. The offertory anthem is Faire is the Heaven by English organist and composer William Harris. This piece is written for double choir, a capella. The text is from a 16th-century poem by Edmund Spenser called "An Hymn of Heavenly Beauty." The poem describes the various occupants of heaven.

Join us for at Redeemer for our All Souls' Day service on **Saturday**, **November 2**, **at 6** p.m. Fr. Michael Hurst is the preacher.

The mass setting is the Mass in E-flat by Josef Rheinberger, who composed the mass in 1878 and dedicated it to Pope Leo XIII. The offertory anthem is *De Profundis* by minimalist Estonian composer Arvo Pärt. It is a setting of the Latin text of Psalm 130 (Out of the deep), a text speaking of profound distress that has inspired countless composers through the centuries. It is written for four-part men's choir, percussion, and organ.


After the All Souls' Day service, we will have a **wine and cheese reception** in the courtyard (weather permitting) or Gillespie Hall. All are welcome!

Redeemer Faces Impacts from Hurricane Helene and Hurricane Milton

Hurricane Helene made landfall in Florida's Big Bend area on September 26. Its storm surge caused extensive damage to Sarasota's barrier islands, and water nearly reached the church. Two weeks later, Hurricane Milton made landfall on Siesta Key on October 9, leading to damage throughout Sarasota. Redeemer faced many downed branches, but as with Helene, the church and offices sustained no water intrusion. Thank you to our staff and parishioners who helped us prepare and recover from these storms.


